WIS 100
I-43 TO HANK AARON STATE TRAIL



August 25, 2020

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) has begun the WIS 100 (I-43 to Hank Aaron State Trail) resurfacing project, and the following lane reductions are scheduled to take place.

Please note that all work is weather dependent and subject to change.

TRAFFIC IMPACTS:

Root River Bridge

- WIS 100 (northbound and southbound), was reduced to one lane in each direction over the Root River, for bridge repairs, and will remain one lane long-term.

WIS 100 (northbound and southbound), between Hank Aaron State Trail and just north of the Root River bridge:

Daytime Work

- WIS 100, between Hank Aaron State Trail and just north of the Root River bridge, is scheduled to be reduced to two lanes in each direction, during daytime hours, through late fall 2020.

Nighttime Work

- WIS 100, between Hank Aaron State Trail and just north of the Root River bridge, is scheduled to be reduced to one lane in each direction, overnight, through late fall 2020.

Businesses and residents should be aware that noise and dust will be associated with this work and that steps will be taken to minimize these effects.
